A manual for equine-assisted learning and therapy professionals will follow.

This document is especially handy when working with a new facilitator for the first time. All guidelines address situations that have actually come up in practice. They are not theoretical.

M&H Grand Rounds_MMH_2.ppt—A PowerPoint presentation for Grand Rounds-type medical conferences that can be modified with your organization's logo, background, local pictures, and updated with new information published on the doctor-patient relationship, medical education, and equine-assisted learning and therapies.

M&H Intro_MMH_3.pdf — The essential monograph describing the philosophy, rationale, and objectives for Medicine and Horsemanship. We include this article in the course syllabus.

Projection_MMH_3.pdf—A monograph discussing the Jungian basis of Medicine and Horsemanship and the psychodynamics of the doctor-patient relationship. This material is

prerequisite for many of the exercises with the horses. We include this article in the course syllabus.

USMLE 2 CS 2009.pdf – Most US medical students, and many foreign students, must pass the United States Medical Licensing Exam Steps 1 and 2 to obtain the MD degree and must additionally pass Step 3 for State Licensure. The Step 2 Clinical Skills exam states "The ability to communicate effectively with patients, demonstrating appropriate interpersonal skills, is essential to safe and effective patient care. Step 2 CS is intended to determine whether physicians seeking an initial license to practice medicine in the United States, regardless of country of origin, can communicate effectively with patients. Carefully developed rating scales, as well as intensive training in their use, are used by the standardized patients to assess communication, interpersonal skills, and English-speaking skills."

Well-Being (formerly Safety) Agreement_MMH_3.doc—A verbal agreement included in the course syllabus and discussed interactively during Opening Ceremonies. The agreement articulates personal and group responsibility for fostering physical health and safety, emotional trust, and confidentiality. This handout has been conscientiously revised to de-emphasize the fear subtext of many of the deconstructed safety agreements (and safety demonstrations) presented in equine workshops. (See the Horsensei Facilitator's Guide for further commentary on this point.)

4. SYLLABUS_SCHEDULES

This folder contains the syllabus for our Stanford course for **Spring 2017**, which includes the schedule, plus samples of one-day, three-day, and six-session *Medicine and Horsemanship* programs. The syllabus can be used for any program.

Some documents in the syllabus are core elements from year to year, some change as new or better material becomes available. For medical students, syllabus reading provides the additional hours of coursework needed to fulfill requirements for academic credit.

Schedule times are approximate and highly variable depending on the layout and logistics of the ranch and on the number of people attending. Place locations in these documents are generic descriptors such as "welcome area" and "arena." In the schedules distributed to participants, we use specific place names such as "Jasper Arena North," "Lesson Office Tie Racks," and "Show Hut," so if participants come late or take breaks, they will know where to catch up with the group.

Each major horse activity generally requires 45-90 minutes for set up, including horse relocation, conducting the exercise, and processing.

M&H Syllabus 2017 for flash drive 4.0—This is the syllabus from our 13th year at Stanford School of Medicine. Note that it contains the schedule for the 2-Sunday class and the new monographs on *Natural Horsemanship* and *Somatics*. Syllabus chapters can be made available as Word documents on request.

Taste of M&H_MMH_2.doc.pdf—This 1-day program is suitable for demonstration and pilot workshops in support of establishing a permanent M&H program. The font in the Word document is Paradox/Papyrus and may appear substituted in your display.

M&H 3 Days_MMH_2.pdf—This 3-day program of didactic and horse activities is suitable for a semester or quarter course or a CME series. For venues to which participants must travel more than 45-60 minutes, longer, less frequent classes might be preferable.

M&H 6 Session_MMH_2.doc—A sample program 2 ½ to 3-hour days that comprise our currently preferred schedule for the Stanford quarterly elective. It is conducted on the students' official elective day and is especially suitable when travel times are less than 30 minutes, allowing participants to come for shorter, more frequent classes. Activities vary from year to year.
